GUIDELINES FOR SAFE RETURN TO DORMITORY LIVING AND **IN-PERSON CLASSES**

To: Chief Administrative Officers Chief Education Program Specialist All School Office Personnel Parents and Guardians **Scholars** All Others concerned

- 1. In preparation for the resumption of **in-person classes** following the recent shift to Alternative Delivery Mode (ADM) due to successive weather disturbances, this Office reiterates that the health, safety, and overall well-being of our students remain our top priority.
- 2. As we welcome our learners back to campus, we seek the support and cooperation of the entire BHSA community to help ensure our students are physically, mentally, and emotionally ready for dormitory life and classroom-based learning. We strongly encourage everyone to observe the following measures and prepare accordingly:

2.1. Dormitory Essentials and Personal Safety Items

To help maintain cleanliness, prevent illness, and ensure comfort during dormitory stay, all students are advised to bring the following items:

- Mosquito/insect repellent
- Clean rags or cleaning cloths
- Portable/rechargeable fan
- Flashlight and power bank
- Extra bedsheet and/or comforter
- Rubber boots and/or non-slip slippers
- Multivitamins and immune boosters
- Over-the-counter medications (e.g., Biogesic, Loperamide)
- Personal prescription medications, if any (e.g., for asthma, allergies, infections)
- Reusable water bottle and umbrella/raincoat, for daily protection
- Face masks and alcohol/sanitizers, for personal hygiene
 - 2.1.1. Students bringing portable/rechargeable fans and power banks are required to register these items with dormitory personnel upon check-in for proper recording and monitoring of electricity usage, in line with our safety and energy management protocols.

2.2. Disaster Preparedness Measures

- Participate actively in emergency drills and follow dormitory staff instructions during alerts
- Call the attention of dormitory personnel regarding any signs of structural damage, flooding, or hazards in dorm rooms
